It is a concept that if you see something bad coming your way, and you prepare for it so it is not as bad, people will be angry because you overreacted. All the work that is being done in the school is to protect those at high risk, and while you may not agree with everything that is being done, it would be difficult to argue with the reason behind it. For us, it is not about politics, or conspiracies, it is about creating the best environment we can for everyone involved, and we are asking that everyone help us to achieve this.




